Language certificate requirements: Students can check their language level here: Self-Assessment Grid (CEFR)	<p>8.A) Proof of Italian language Proficiency (A2 level), if only courses taught in Italian will be attended.</p> <p>This could be an official letter from a language instructor at student's home university stating that student's Italian skills are sufficient to study abroad.</p> <p>It is highly recommended that students have at least a basic level of Italian (A2) before coming to our university, since our classes are taught mainly in Italian. In addition, they are encouraged to take the Intensive Italian Language course at the beginning of September or during the summer.</p>

	<p>8.B) Proof of English proficiency (B1 level), if only courses taught in English will be attended.</p> <p>8.C) BOTH Languages competences (A2 Italian level and B1 English level) if courses in both languages will be attended.</p>
VISA requirements and RESIDENCE PERMIT	<p>NON EU students must have a valid VISA Entry. In June (after deadline of 30 June) the international office will issue and send an official invitation letter to Partner University and to Exchange Student once received the Application Form signed. Students should start the Visa procedure at the Italian Consulate as soon as they receive the Invitation letter. Italian Language Courses offered by CIS (Italian Language Centre)	We require that students taking courses in Italian have at least A2 Level according to the CEFR when they start and study at UNIBG. However, we expect the home university to make sure their students have the required language proficiency. During the semester, students can improve Italian attending the General Italian Courses.
