Thai language course	Students may take language courses on a fee-paying basis in one of the numerous language schools in Bangkok.
Accommodation	The EBA program assists in arranging accommodation. Subject to availability incoming students may stay at <u>CU iHouse</u> , which is located within walking distance to the Faculty of Economics. Students also may stay at serviced apartment in Bangkok.
Visa	Before coming to Thailand, you must obtain a <b>non-immigrant visa category ED</b> from the Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate in your country. Information about immigration matters is available on the website at <u>https://www.thaiembassy.org/</u>
Health insurance	All students are <b>recommended</b> to purchase adequate health and liability insurance prior to their departure. Once students have arrived in Thailand, they will be required to pay a group health insurance fee of 2,000 baht per academic year.
