Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences	In the Fall semester: exams take place during the last two weeks of the semester and the second week of January. In the Spring semester: exams take place two weeks before and after the end of the semester.			

Faculty of Law	In both the Fall and Spring semesters: exams take place within the 'academic calendar' dates listed above. Please note that these dates might differ to the exam dates for regular (non-exchange) students.	
Faculty of Economics and Management	In both the Fall and Spring semesters: exams take place during the last two weeks of the semester.

Application and Registrations Procedures	We only accept nominations sent by the International Relations Office of our partner universities.	
	We use <i>Mobility-Online</i> for both the nomination and the application processes. Mobility coordinators will receive an email with detailed instructions on how to nominate their students using our platform.	
	Nominated students, in turn, will receive detailed information how to complete their application online, as well as other information pertinent to their mobility semester, including registration dates.	
Course Information, Orientation Program and Learning Agreement	For all study-related issues such as learning agreements, credits, assessments, etc., please contact the departmental coordinator at the corresponding faculty.	
Language of Instruction	Students must be able to take courses in English or German. We don't request an official language proficiency score.	
German course for beginners	During the 'Orientation Week' for exchange students the University of Lucerne offers a free pre-semester taster course 'German Short Course". An application form will be sent as part of the application pack. Students who wish to continue studying German during the course of the semester can opt to take a German beginner's course at a cost of 100CHF. 2 ECTS credits are awarded for this course.	
Accommodation	Student accommodation can usually be provided to all exchange students, however since there is a limit to the student rooms avail- able, you are advised to complete your room application as soon as you receive it. Non-German-speaking students have priority of reservation. The application form for housing is part of the online application process. If you have further accommodation-related questions, please con- tact the Institutional Mobility Coordinator.

General Information		
Health Insurance	Students from within any of the EU 28 countries, as well as Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway, are eligible for the 'European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), which provides sufficient health insurance coverage for Switzerland. Any student from Europe who is unable to get EHIC coverage should contact the Institutional Mobility Coor- dinator for further assistance. Please note that travel insurance taken out in your home country is not equivalent to Swiss health insurance cover and will not be ac-	
	cepted by the authorities.	
Personal Liability Insurance	For exchange students who will stay at university arranged accommodation, personal liability insurance is mandatory! Exchange students should check before leaving their home country whether their personal liability insurance coverage is sufficient for Switzerland. Please note that it is usually cheaper and more con- venient to organise this type of insurance cover in your home coun- try. For students organising their own accommodation, personal liability insurance is not compulsory but it is strongly recommended since it offers an insurance cover for third party liability claims and will cover costs relating to damage of rented accommodation.

Visa	Students from EU and EFTA countries need a valid passport or identity card to enter Switzerland. For non-EU/EFTA nationals: Please contact the Swiss Embassy in your home country to start the visa application process as soon as you receive the official admission letter issued by the University of Lucerne. We would advise all students to travel with a passport.	
Residence Permit / Costs	All incoming students are required to get a Residence Permit for their stay in Switzerland. The University of Lucerne will apply for this Residence Permit on behalf of the students. Your Residence Permit will be issued after you have registered with the Registration Office of your community of residence (see below). Costs for the Residence Permit: approx. CHF 70 for EU/EFTA students; approx. CHF 250 for non-EU/EFTA students; these costs must be borne by the students.	
Entering – Registration / Costs	After entering Switzerland, all students are required to register at the Registration Office of their community of residence. More in- formation about this will be communicated to students during Orien- tation Week. Costs for the registration: approx CHF 35
